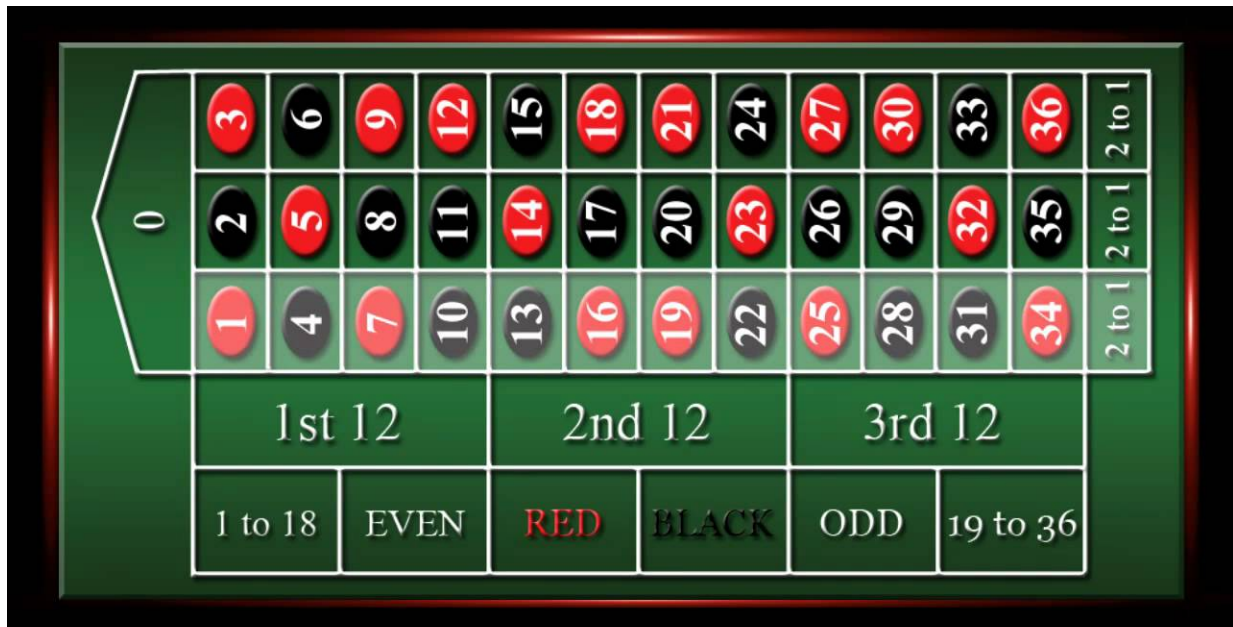


## How to Play Roulette



Roulette is one of the easiest casino games to play.

There are no complex strategies to memorize or complicated rules to worry about.

However, the multitude of bets and the wide range in odds and payouts can be somewhat confusing for many new players.

Roulette is a game played with a large wheel of numbered and colored pockets. The croupier (or dealer) spins a ball on the outer rim of the wheel, after which it falls into one of the numbered spaces. The object for the player is to guess the number/color the ball will land in.

Outside bets give players a better chance of winning, but winners receive a lower payout. For example, players can bet the ball will land in an even or an odd numbered pocket, or that it will land in a red or black pocket.

Inside bets include betting the ball will land in a specific number (pays out at 35-1,) a pair of numbers (pays out at 17-1,) a square of four numbers (8-1,) or two rows of adjacent numbers, (5-1.)

Since roulette is a game of chance, there's very little players can do to increase their odds of winning.

You must decide if you want to take a conservative approach or do you want to win big? (Or lose big!)
